

Senators' executive honoured

Businesswomen of the year

Erin Crowe, the Ottawa Senators' executive vice-president and chief financial officer, has been named corporate Ottawa Businesswoman of the Year for 2009.

Crowe received her award at a ceremony Thursday night at the Hampton Inn and Conference Centre in Ottawa.

As alternate governor of Senators Sports and Entertainment, she is one of the first females to hold that position in the NHL. The umbrella organization owns and operates the team and Scotiabank Place.

Crowe was promoted to her current role in June 2009 after 13 years with the Senators organization in increasingly-senior financial positions.

She is on the board of the Children's Hospital of Eastern Ontario and Roger's House.

Named winner in the entrepreneur category was Mia Hempey, president and CEO of CTE Solutions Inc., an Ottawa technology training company she co-founded in 2002. "Through her leadership, the company has been profitable since inception," and has grown to be one of the largest Microsoft Learning Solution Providers in the country, said the awards' organizer, the Women's Business Network. In 2008, she was chosen by Microsoft to sit on its Partner Advisory Council.

Hempey had held senior management positions at Ottawa high-tech firms such as Harris Computer Systems and Learnix Ltd. She sits on the board of the Ottawa chapter of the EO Organization, an international group that encourages entrepreneurs to learn from each other.

Brenda Hollingsworth was the recipient in the professional category.

She is a plaintiff-side personal injury lawyer and with her husband and law partner Richard Auger, owns and operates the litigation boutique law firm Auger Hollings-worth.

She has co-authored two books, *An Injured Victim's Guide to Fair Compensation* and *Crash Course: A Savvy Woman's Guide to Ontario Car Accident Cases*.
